## **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

5. Supervisor opened the Public Hearings for Private Road Maintenance Special Assessment Rolls for the following private roads: Clearwater Trl, Diamond Drive, Shangri-La Subdivision, Nels Road, South Horseshoe Trl (N of 72) and Arbutus Trl. The necessity of these projects were approved at the September 21, 2022, Public Hearings. This Public Hearing is to receive and review the proposed Special Assessment Rolls for above cited private roads.

**Clearwater Trail:** Tentative Special Assessment Roll is 2,727.00 per year for five years and based on 12 residents. Each resident has an estimated annual assessment of 227.25. One correspondence in favor no public comment.

**Diamond Drive:** Tentative Special Assessment Roll is \$4,242.00 per year for five years based on 22 properties. Each property has an estimated annual assessment of \$192.82. No correspondence one public public comment in favor.

**Shangri-la Subdivision:** Tentative Special Assessment Roll is \$15,150.00 per year for five years spread over 46 properties. Each property has an estimated annual assessment of \$329.35. Two correspondence in favor no public comment.

**Nels Road:** Tentative Special Assessment Roll is \$1,212.00 per year for five years spread over 6 properties. Each property has an estimated annual assessment of \$202.00. No correspondence and no public comment.

**South Horseshoe Trail (N of 72):** Tentative Special Assessment Roll is \$9,595.00 per year for five years spread over 63 property owners. Each property has an estimated annual assessment of \$152.30. No correspondence and public comment from four residents all were in favor they just had questions about the process and how to get added services.

**Arbutus Lane:** Tentative Special Assessment Roll is \$2,166.45 per year for one year spread over 11 property owners. Each property has an estimated annual assessment of \$196.95. one correspondence against and Dave Swiercz spoke in favor and said over half the residents are in favor of the A-1 bid for one year. Letter with signatures on file Attachment "A". Supervisor Stephan explained there would be additional administrative fees due to the fact that it is only one year and not five. Suggested we table till November 16, 2022 meeting so we have time to notify property owners of the new cost.

Motion by Smock support by Selthoffer, to adopt the Special Assessment Roll for **Nels Road** in the amount of \$1,212.00 per year for five years and authorize it be placed on the December 1, 2022 Tax Roll. All ayes, motion carried.

Motion by Smock support by Selthoffer, to adopt the Special Assessment Roll for **South Horseshoe Trail (N of 72)** in the amount of \$9,595.00 per year for five years and authorize it be placed on the December 1, 2022 Tax Roll. All ayes, motion carried.
